This year has been a year of transition and transformation at Opportunity House.

The Second Street Learning Center served over 207 children this year. We expanded our Pre-K counts program to address the increased need in the community. Our staff received over 400 hours of specialized training to provide high-quality early

education to our students.

Renovations were a major focus throughout our organization. At

Beacon House, apartments were updated with

new kitchens, bathrooms, flooring, and paint. It is the first major renovation since it opened in 1992. New HVAC units were

> installed in our permanent housing on Beech Street.

The Shelter renovations expanded our capacity by transforming our basement storage area into added beds for clients. The block building, across the street from the shelter, was transformed into storage space and added parking. Renovations of the day




